The Accelerated BS program has a competitive admissions process. Applicants are required to have a bachelor's degree in any field, and must have also completed the following courses satisfactorily:

- General Chemistry or Organic Biochemistry or General Chemistry II (4 credits with lab)
- Anatomy and Physiology I & II (8 credits with labs)
- Microbiology (4 credits with lab)
- Statistics (3 credits)
- Human Growth and Development (3 credits)
- Nutrition (3 credits)
- Genetics (3 credits, no lab required)
- Biomedical Ethics (3 credits)

In addition to the above mentioned requirements, applicants must complete an Admission Application at <a href="http://admissions.rutgers.edu">http://admissions.rutgers.edu</a>.

International students must submit transcripts from all colleges and universities attended to the Admissions Office. All records must be original documents or certified true copies. Transcripts not in English must be accompanied by a translation verified by and approved member of NACES (<a href="http://www.naces.org/">http://www.naces.org/</a>). Students whose secondary schooling has been completed outside the US in a country where English is not the principal language are also required to take an English Proficiency Examination (TOEFL). The scores must be submitted to the Admissions Office.
