

Nursing admissions is competitive. All of the following prerequisite course requirements must be successfully completed (with at least a “C” grade) before starting the Traditional Nursing Program. Since science course grades carry the most weight in admissions decisions, applicants should complete as many as possible before applying. Acceptance offers will be rescinded if students fail to successfully complete and/or submit transcripts for courses that were in progress at the time of acceptance.

Traditional Nursing Program, Sophomore Year*

Prerequisites (with Rutgers course numbers):

- English Composition I (50:350:101 or 50:989:101)
- English Composition II (50:350:102 or 50:989:102)
- Introduction to Psychology (50:830:101)
- Chemistry I AND II with labs, OR General Organic Biochemistry with lab (50:160:115 AND 50:160:116, OR 50:160:103)
- Anatomy & Physiology I and II with labs (50:120:253 and 50:120:254)
- Nutrition (50:520:255 or 57:705:255)
- Statistics (50:830:250 or 50:960:183)

*** The Traditional Nursing Program will take transfer students a minimum of three years to complete.**

The following courses must be completed prior to applying: A&P I, English Composition I, and Intro to Psychology.

The remaining prerequisites, including A&P II, must be either completed or in-progress at the time of application. Courses planned to be taken in the summer semester cannot and will not be counted as in-progress at the time of review.

The following *can increase* the chance of acceptance:

- Completion of all prerequisites before applying
- Science prerequisites completed
- GPA \geq 3.3
- A science GPA of \geq 3.0

Applicants should submit documentation with application indicating courses in progress
